




Foreword

The Youth Provincial Assembly Punjab is a new PILDAT initiative, which is patterned after the Provincial Assembly of the Punjab. Its membership, 40 in total, is to be drawn from across all districts of Punjab. The specific objectives of the YPAP are to groom the leadership potential of the youth from Punjab to help them articulate their views on national and provincial policies in an informed and structured manner through dialogue and debates.

PILDAT has been successfully running the Youth Parliament Pakistan on the national basis since 2007. In 2013, PILDAT established and facilitated the first-ever Youth Provincial Assembly Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (YPA-KP) focussed on engaging with the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Youth in a healthy discourse and exposing them to democratic process and practices.

Youth forms a very significant segment of Pakistani society. Over forty per cent of Pakistan's population is 18 years old or younger. Violent extremism in Pakistan has become organic feature of internal security environment of Pakistan mostly involving youth of the country. More often than not, religious extremism alone is generally ascribed to turbulent environment of Pakistan. It indeed accounts for significant proportion of instability, yet in realty it is only a fractional component of the holistic setting which is beset by several forms of violence-prone undercurrents and trends.

It is with this background that focus is placed on youth through a dedicated Youth Provincial Assembly Punjab to engage youth from the province to help rationalize their thought process about extremism and build their capacity to act as catalyst and initiate constructive change in their communities in particular.

This Introductory Book presents details about the first batch of Youth Provincial Assembly Punjab and its selected members. We at PILDAT, as the Secretariat of Youth Provincial Assembly Punjab, look forward to receiving feedback and input of young Members and other stakeholders so as to enhance the effectiveness and efficiency of this exercise in the future.

- iv. Reviewing progress and operation of the Youth Provincial Assembly Punjab



Why a Youth Provincial Assembly Punjab?

Background

As PILDAT launched the first-ever **Youth Parliament Pakistan** in 2007, the goals before us were to strengthen Pakistan's democratic institutions through inculcating democratic culture in the Youth of Pakistan. 09-years on, we have made our modest efforts through 8 batches of Youth Parliament Pakistan to generate open, fact-based and informed discourse on issues facing the country and develop tools, mechanisms and systems to facilitate the exposure of democratic system to the Youth of Pakistan. Through the Youth Parliament Pakistan, we have also encouraged that the Youth to understand extremism and how to tackle it through deeper understanding, engagement and dialogue based on the principles of supremacy of rule of law in Pakistan.

After the 18th Amendment to the Constitution resulting in devolved powers to the provinces, PILDAT also began working on more-province focused Youth Assemblies in 2013 that can be patterned after Provincial Assemblies and can have a keener focus on provincial policies. Thus in 2013, PILDAT established and successfully facilitated the first-ever Youth Provincial Assembly Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (YPA-KP) focussed on engaging with the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Youth in a healthy discourse and exposing them to democratic process and practices.

With the firm faith that a steady and positive engagement with Pakistani youth is the best interest of the society, **PILDAT** has now launched the first-ever **Youth Provincial Assembly Punjab (YPAP)** focused only on the youth of Province of Punjab.


The Youth Provincial Assembly Punjab is a new PILDAT initiative, which is patterned after the Provincial Assembly of the Punjab. Its membership, 40 in total, is drawn from across all districts of Punjab. The specific objectives of the YPAP are to groom the leadership potential of the youth from Punjab to help them articulate their views on national and provincial policies in an informed and structured manner through dialogue and debates.

The Youth Provincial Assembly Punjab will have its own 2-party system, Deputy Speaker, Leader of the House and Opposition, as well as an augmented system of Committees. As a pilot initiative, the YPAP members are expected to join 3 sessions of 3-days each between October-December 2016.

PILDAT functions as the Secretariat of the Youth Provincial Assembly of Punjab. A Steering Committee is formed to oversee the functioning of the YPAP through periodic meetings.

Youth Provincial Assembly Punjab

The objective behind conceptualizing a dedicated Youth Provincial Assembly Punjab is to engage youth from the province



to help inform, guide and rationalize their thought process about extremism and build their capacity to act as catalyst and initiate constructive change in their communities.

The YPAP is expected to provide an opportunity to target youth to form a network and provide a platform for them to discuss their ideas directly with Punjab's legislators and policy makers as well as activating them in their communities. The effort is intended to assist young members in defining extremism and conflict and understand peace building through mediation, negotiation, and dialogue.

PILDAT felt it important to engage the Youth of Punjab in healthy discourse and expose them to democratic traditions and culture so that they may be groomed as a civilised, tolerant and peaceful citizens. The concept of Youth Provincial Assembly Punjab emerged as a way for young people to "learn by doing," through taking part in Youth Provincial Assembly Punjab. It was felt that practice on the benches of a mock Provincial Assembly can be useful in deciding how to become a more active citizen, either inside or outside formal politics.

The project of Youth Provincial Assembly Punjab is seen as a way to inculcate democratic culture in Punjab Youth and to facilitate free but structured expression of their views. The Youth Provincial Assembly Punjab is also seen as a key towards achieving the objective of support for democracy and growth and sustenance of democratic institutions in Punjab and Pakistan.

It is often said that widespread apathy exists among the younger generation towards political participation and Parliamentary democracy. Whether this fear is exaggerated or not, without doubt young people need to understand the principles which underpin democracy and civil society, develop the skills to use that knowledge effectively and be able to participate at the appropriate form. One method of assisting young people to understand these principles is through a simulation of legislatures.

Youth Provincial Assembly Punjab provides participants of Punjab with an opportunity to acquire or improve upon many skills such as public speaking, debate, presentation, research and organisational skills, aiding their personal development. Most importantly, the YPAP will focus, in each session, on specially-designed workshops on understanding and tackling extremism for the youth to help them better-prepared for addressing this malaise in their communities across Punjab's districts.


Objectives

Specific objectives of the YPAP are to educate and rationalise youth's thought process about extremism including giving them an exposure towards working of politics and democracy in Pakistan. In addition, the YPAP serves as a useful forum to voice views of the Youth of Punjab about a range of Provincial and National issues. The debates in the YPAP are meant to not only help the young Members in their personal development as a useful citizen, these also serve the purpose of articulating views of the youth on vital issues facing the Province and conveying these to the Government. The specific objectives of the YPAP are to:

a. Understand and simulate on how Provincial Assembly works




- Get oriented on matters of Provincial & National Concern
- c. Understand violent extremism, its drivers and study and evaluate implementation of existing policies on countering violent extremism (CVE)
- d. Engage with legislators and policy makers on existing CVE strategies and their implementation
- e. Hold public representatives in Assembly and in Government to account
- f. Critically evaluate existing policies and laws and propose revisions to those in YPAP Committees, present and defend policy proposals and engage with legislators and policy makers for their inclusion in policies



Key Features of Youth Provincial Assembly Punjab

- 1. The Youth Provincial Assembly Punjab is a new PILDAT initiative which is to be patterned after the Provincial Assembly of the Punjab.
- 2. Its membership, 40 in total, is to be drawn from across all districts of Punjab.
- 3. The objective behind conceptualizing a dedicated Youth Provincial Assembly Punjab is to engage youth from the province to help inform, guide and rationalize their thought process about extremism and build their capacity to act as catalyst and initiate constructive change in their communities.
- 4. YPAP is expected to provide an opportunity to the target youth to form a network and provide a platform for them to discuss their ideas directly with Punjab's legislators and policy makers as well as activating them in their communities. The effort is intended to also assist young members in understanding extremism and conflict and understand peace building through mediation, negotiation, and dialogue.
- 5. The Youth Provincial Assembly Punjab will have its own 2-party system, Deputy Speaker, Leader of the House and Opposition, as well as an augmented system of Committees.
- As a pilot initiative, the YPAP members are expected to join 3 sessions of 3-days each between October-December 2016.
- At the end of each session, YPAP would hold a press conference briefing the media about the proceedings of the session.
- YPAP will have a series of three workshops in each
 of the three session for its membership on the
 subject of extremism and its relationship with the
 Youth.

- 9. The Youth Provincial Assembly Punjab will have four fixed areas of policy review.
- 10. Top 3 Best performing Members will be given 'Best Legislators Award' in the final session of the YPAP
- 11. The committee evaluated to have conceptualised the best policy proposal will be given the 'Best Committee Award'
- 12. All YPAP Members will be awarded certificates upon conclusion of the term of YPAP
- 13. The YPAP will be given an opportunity to showcase its work, policy proposals and learning through an interaction with Punjab's legislators, policy makers and media upon the conclusion of the YPAP term
- 14. The first batch of Youth provincial Assembly Punjab will form following Youth Standing Committees focussed on review of critical policy areas:
- i. Youth Standing Committee on Rule of Law
- ii. Youth Standing Committee on Information
- iii. Youth Standing Committee on Youth Affairs
- iv. Youth Standing Committee on Education
- 15. As a model Provincial Assembly for the Youth of Punjab, the Youth Provincial Assembly Punjab is patterned after the Provincial Assembly of Punjab although its membership is smaller than that of the Provincial Assembly of Punjab. Wherever possible, the Youth Provincial Assembly Punjab follows the rules of procedures as close to the Punjab Provincial Assembly as practical. However, better practices from other Assemblies are adopted to expose the Youth of Punjab to better Parliamentary practices.
- 16. Youth Standing Committee on Information formed within the YPAP will be responsible for ensuring extensive coverage of the YPAP and its daily



sessions in print, electronic and social media. Members of the committee would be expected to call on the key newspapers and electronic channels management and invite them to visit the YPAP. The YPAP will have its own website which will carry detailed proceedings and pictures of the assembly. The Youth Standing Committee on Information will issue a press release at the end of each day of meetings. The Chairperson and members of the Information Committee will be responsible for organizing session-wise press conferences and ensure in addition that media shows keen interest in daily proceedings of the YPAP and its policy proposals.

The total membership of Youth Provincial Assembly Punjab is 40. The breakdown of the Membership is as follows:

Age

Only those young domicile holders of Punjab, between the ages of 18-29 years on January 01, 2016, are eligible to seek membership of the YPAP.

Guest Speakers

Eminent provincial legislators, experts, policy makers and office bearers are to be invited to address the YPAP as Guest Speakers.

Members' Political Affiliation

There is no bar on the actual political affiliation of the members of the Youth Provincial Assembly Punjab. However, Youth Provincial Assembly Punjab will have two mock political parties: the *Blue Party* and the *Green Party*. The members will be asked to join either one of the political parties for the purpose of Youth Provincial Assembly Punjab. Joining one of the parties is obligatory for Members.

Life of the Youth Provincial Assembly-Punjab

Youth Provincial Assembly Punjab is expected to meet for 3 sessions of 3 days each.

Minimum Work Days

The Youth Provincial Assembly- Punjab will meet for at least 9 days during its term.

Venue

Lahore

Media Gallery

Media will be invited to cover the proceedings through a Press Gallery.

Visitors Gallery

Public will be able to observe proceedings from a Visitors' Gallery.

Liaison with Provincial Assembly Standing Committees

The YPAP Standing Committees will be facilitated to interact with their counterpart Committees in the

Provincial Assembly of the Punjab.

Subsistence Allowance

Youth Provincial Assembly Punjab is a membershipbased project. It is not an employment or internship opportunity for Youth; therefore, there is no salary to be paid to those who are selected as members of the Youth Provincial Assembly-Punjab. However, there will be a limited travel and subsistence allowance for members to attend the sessions of the Youth Provincial Assembly Punjab. For members travelling from outside Lahore area, the travel allowance would include reimbursement (upon submission of original receipt) of first-class return train/bus fare from hometown of Member to Lahore. Members who are not residents of Lahore (residents include local residents and those living in hostels/existing accommodation in Lahore) will be provided with shared accommodation for up to 3 nights during the sessions. All travel and transport related arrangements will be the responsibility of the Member who will be reimbursed as per the above conditions upon sharing original receipts.


Selection of Participants

The process of selection of participants for the Youth Provincial Punjab has been multi-tiered and involved the following steps:

- Submission of Expression of Interest by interested candidates of the previous batches of Youth Parliament Pakistan
- 2. Internal review of Expressions of Interest
- 3. Selection Calls and Invitations for becoming Members of Youth Provincial Assembly Punjab

Selection Criteria

Following criteria for selection has been adopted:



- Interested candidates should be citizens of Pakistan and domicile holder of a district of Punjab
- 2. Age of interested candidates should not be less than 18 years and more than 29 years on January 01, 2016.
- Interested candidates should be able to read and write Urdu
- 4. There should be no criminal record against interested candidates in Pakistan or abroad

Efforts have been made to ensure that all districts of Punjab are represented in the finally selected Members including adequate representation to women and persons belonging to religious minorities.

Additionally, the Expression of Interest Form sought to gauge the following from the candidates' responses:

- Commitment to understand and propose policy options for countering violent extremism
- b. Knowledge of related constituency & districts
- c. Ability and aptitude to understand national and provincial policy issues
- d. Availability to join and actively engage in and contribute to all YPAP sessions

- 4. Reviewing progress and operation of the Youth Provincial Assembly Punjab



Mr. Qasim Sarfraz YPAP-05-CHAKWAL01




Mr. Malik Waqas Hameed YPAP-07-DERAGHAZIKHAN01


Ms. Namra Arshad YPAP-09-GUJRANWALA01

Mr. Ghalib Nawaz YPAP-11-HAFIZABAD01


